Sawyer Camp Trail Walk

Friday, March 20, 2009, 10:00 AM

This month we will visit Sawyer Camp Trail, located just off Highway 280 in San Mateo County. The trail parallels picturesque Crystal Springs Lake and San Andreas Lake. The pristine watershed area surrounding the trail is recognized as a Fish Wildlife refuge and a Biosphere Reserve. The trail is paved and relatively flat, suitable for hikers of all levels. Restrooms and benches are conveniently located along the trail. On this out and back walk we plan to cover about 7 miles, stopping midway for lunch at the Jepson Laurel area where the largest and oldest known laurel tree in California stands. For those who prefer a shorter hike, there are distance markers every ½ mile and you can turn around at any point. Bicycles are permitted on the trail, which is paved for 6 miles.

To get to the trail, travel north on Highway 280. Pass the Highway 92 exit (about 22 miles north of the 280/85 junction) and exit at Bunker Hill Road. Turn left to cross over the freeway, then turn right onto the frontage road, continuing along the road and crossing the bridge. Park anywhere near the stop sign. We will meet at the trail entrance, which is on the left. People wanting to car pool should meet at the Camden Park & Ride (Camden & Hwy 85) at 9:00 AM. Don't forget lunch and water.
